MANDATED PROGRAMS

Local and State funds assist in making our State mandated programs available **free of charge** to people who live or work in Windsor Locks and East Granby. State Law Sec. 10-73a requires that the adult education services described in this section be provided by local school districts, **free of charge**, to any adult 17 years of age or older who is not enrolled in a public elementary or secondary school program. You may also drop off your registration forms at the Adult Ed mailbox in the high school's main office during the day. **If you do NOT receive notification, you may assume that your registration is complete, and your class will be held as scheduled.**
